

1	Segregation	To segregate means to separate people from each other.
2	Arrested	Seize (Someone) by legal authority and take them to custody.
3	Unfair	Not based on or behaving according to the principles of equality and justice.
4	Boycott	Withdraw from commercial or social relations with (a country, organisation or person) as a punishment or protest.
5	Bravery	Courageous behaviour or character.
6	Activism	The policy or action of using vigorous campaigning to bring about political or social change.
7	Refuse	Indicate or show that one is not willing to do something.
8	Civil Rights	The rights of citizens to political and social freedom and equality.
9	Supreme Court	The highest judicial court in a country or a state.
10	Activist	A person who campaigns to bring out political or social change.
