Expectations in Year 4

Homework and spellings

- Homework will be set differently this year. At the start of each half term, the children will be sent home a grid, of varying activities, to complete based on the topics that they are learning.
- The tasks will need to be completed by half term that said, they are not compulsory.
- Once a task has been completed, you can send a photograph on Seesaw.
- Mr Varney will send home a letter, next week, to clarify homework further. The children won't get any homework during this first week back.
- The spelling curriculum is changing, children will have two discreet lessons per week, so children (at this stage) won't need to learn spellings at home, unless we state otherwise.



Reading

- It is important that children read for at least 10 minutes every day 4x a week.
- Reading 7 times a week = 3 merits
 - Reading 6 times a week = 2 merits
 - Reading 4 times a week = 1 merit
- New books will be given out on a Friday. If you haven't finished your book before then you can keep it for longer.
- Any book you read can be written in your Reading Record but please make sure your school book is being read alongside any books from home/the library.
